Background

Syrian NGOs (SNGOs) were established in response to the need for humanitarian assistance inside Syria and also meet the needs of Refugees in neighboring countries post March 2011. Some SNGOs felt the need for a body where common advocacy messages relating to humanitarian issues are being agreed. Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) saw the light on the 2nd April 2014 in Gaziantep, Turkey.

SNA consists of 22 SNGOs who are some of the largest SNGOs working to meet the Humanitarian needs in line with international standards and protocols. SNA provides the umbrella for these SNGOs to coordinate and advocate common messages ensuring the voices of affected populations heard. Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) Advocacy Activities

SNA participates and attends several periodic and scheduled meetings through SNA secretariats team or SNA NGO-members, including HLG, ICCG, SSG, ICVA, SCSP, NGO Forum GA meeting, PAWG meeting of SIRF, and SCNP following up on updated contexts that support the mandate of the SNA, providing updates on the context, funding, access, coordination, joint planning, Emergency Planning, Contingency Planning, the main gaps and challenges as well as the access challenges, along with products to be worked on while helping stakeholders better understand SNGOs' perspectives on the current situation and priorities.

On July 8th, As an advocacy effort seeking sustainable delivery of humanitarian assistance, SNA released a video on the importance of XB modality, the video highlighted the worsening humanitarian situation and key figures of increasing need in various humanitarian sectors in NW of Syria.

On July 24, SNA in coordination with Dr Daher Zeidan, held Second training (empowering the Syrian) entitled: Professionalism at work, leadership and soft skills. Where 43 trainees took part of this initiative including 13 SNA NGO-members staff.

SNA organized series of training entitled "AI Utilization in Humanitarian Context, Navigating Funding Opportunities in Challenging Times, and Presentation Skills for Donors and Funding Partners" in partnership with Cooperative Development Group, held on July 16-17, 19, and 22-23 in Gaziantep.

First training aimed to explore innovative applications of AI to enhance the impact of humanitarian work. Second training focused on equipping participants with strategies to secure and manage funding effectively amidst global challenges. Third training aimed to empower participants with the skills needed to effectively communicate and advocate for their humanitarian initiatives.

Key Recent Developments

On 30 June, anti-refugee protests broke out in central Türkiye following a report of harassment of a child in the city of Kayseri, allegedly by a Syrian refugee. According to reports, Turkish police arrested at least 474 people for targeting properties and Syrian refugees in Türkiye. In response, demonstrations erupted in the next days in parts of north-west Syria, including Afrin, al-Bab, Azez, and Jarablus. The protests were violent, leading to clashes with Turkish armed forces present inside Syria, in
