In times of crisis, humanitarian aid must be guided by the principles of neutrality and impartiality, ensuring that assistance reaches those in need without discrimination. These values are at the heart of the Syrian NGO Alliance's mission.

This excerpt is inspired by the fundamental principles of humanitarian action and international humanitarian law.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Syrian NGOs (SNGOs) were established in response to the need for humanitarian assistance inside Syria and also meet the needs of Refugees in neighboring countries post March 2011. Some SNGOs felt the need for a body where common advocacy messages relating to humanitarian issues are being agreed. Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) saw the light on the 2nd April 2014 in Gaziantep, Turkey.

### WHO ARE WE?

SNA consists of **24 SNGOs** who are some of the largest SNGOs working to meet the Humanitarian needs in line with international standards and protocols. SNA provides the umbrella for these SNGOs to coordinate and advocate common messages ensuring the voices of affected populations heard. We play an active role when it comes to how aid is being delivered in Syria.

# > SYRIAN NGO ALLIANCE (SNA) ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES:

SNA issued a joint statement in coordination with a number of Syrian civil society organizations and institutions, including professional and labor unions, titled "Civil Society for Syria: Statement on the U.S. Lifting Sanctions on Syria." The statement welcomed the recent U.S. decision to lift sanctions imposed on Syria, considering it a positive step towards alleviating the ongoing humanitarian suffering that has persisted for years. It also called for leveraging this development to enhance reconstruction efforts and support local approaches that reflect the aspirations of the Syrian people. The statement was shared across all of the Alliance's media and institutional platforms to ensure its wide reach among stakeholders and civil society.

SNA is actively assessing its current trajectory and planning for the future by establishing a Task Force composed of Alliance members. SNA is leading this initiative to enhance its effectiveness and develop work strategies aligned with ongoing challenges.

SNA is actively involved in advocating for the implementation of a fair salary scale for organizations operating inside Syria. It is overseeing the preparation of a final report expected to be released soon, which will serve as an official reference for SNA members in developing human resources policies and salary management.

SNA played a pivotal role in coordination meetings held in Damascus within the NGO Forum, providing feedback and proposals on the draft Terms of Reference (TOR) related to the criteria for selecting Syrian national members, thereby contributing to the improvement of participation and representation mechanisms within the Alliance.

SNA continues to organize a financial workshop aimed at discussing the financial and administrative challenges related to the transition of humanitarian work inside Syria, focusing on finding practical solutions to ensure operational continuity and developing financial management mechanisms suited to the current phase.
