➤ BACKGROUND:

Syrian NGOs (SNGOs) were established in response to the need for humanitarian assistance inside Syria and also meet the needs of Refugees in neighboring countries post March 2011. Some SNGOs felt the need for a body where common advocacy messages relating to humanitarian issues are being agreed. Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) saw the light on the 2nd April 2014 in Gaziantep, Turkey.

➤ WHO ARE WE?

SNA consists of **22 SNGOs** who are some of the largest SNGOs working to meet the Humanitarian needs in line with international standards and protocols. SNA provides the umbrella for these SNGOs to coordinate and advocate common messages ensuring the voices of affected populations heard. We play an active role when it comes to how aid is being delivered in Syria.

➤ SYRIAN NGO ALLIANCE (SNA) ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES: JULY 2025

4 July 2025 – The Syrian Arab Republic announced its new visual identity on 3 July. SNA published a congratulatory post on its official social media channels, expressing its support for the launch of the new visual identity. The post stated: "We carry our history in our identity... and move confidently towards the future. The Syrian NGO Alliance congratulates this national step towards strengthening identity and belonging, and affirms its support for any initiative that embodies Syria's unity and diversity."

5 July 2025 – SNA shared a solidarity post on its official channels, expressing support for the Ministry of Disasters and Emergencies in its remarkable efforts to combat forest fires. The post also acknowledged the role of firefighting and civil defense teams as the first line of defense. This statement followed widespread fires in Latakia Governorate during July, which destroyed more than 16,000 hectares of forests and agricultural land, affecting 45 villages and approximately 1,200 families. Firefighting and civil defense teams, supported by regional and international teams, succeeded in controlling most of the fires, with cooling and monitoring operations continuing to prevent re-ignition.

26 July 2025 – SNA Coordinator appeared on Syrian News in the program Storya to discuss the UN humanitarian appeal, funding challenges, and aid delivery in Syria. The Coordinator highlighted the UN's extension of the humanitarian response plan, stressing the urgent need for funding to support vulnerable Syrians, particularly in the most affected governorates such as Idlib, which hosts the largest number of displaced persons in camps. He noted that humanitarian needs are immense and current funding is insufficient for direct response. He emphasized that humanitarian work relies mainly on institutional and UN funding, and that government resources alone cannot meet the population's needs. The Coordinator called on civil society, traders, and businesspeople to actively contribute and stressed the importance of prioritizing life-saving interventions, protection, resilience, recovery, livelihoods, and direct support for the most vulnerable to ensure aid reaches those in need effectively.

28 July 2025 – SNA Coordinator appeared for the first time on Syrian News' program "News Hour" to discuss the arrival of humanitarian aid in Sweida and the challenges faced in the field. He explained that aid enters without obstruction from the Syrian authorities, with ongoing coordination from the Ministries of Social Affairs and Labor, Disasters and Emergencies, Health, as well as the Red Crescent, OCHA, and volunteer teams. Challenges mentioned included donor requirements, difficulties in accessing trained humanitarian staff, funding shortages, and reliance on inaccurate data. He emphasized that current convoys represent emergency responses, not long-term plans, and that a large portion of funding goes to logistics rather than directly to beneficiaries. He also highlighted the situation of displaced persons in shelters, stressing the need for emergency response and the importance of planning sustainable solutions. The Coordinator concluded by emphasizing transparent documentation of aid delivery and equitable distribution, with civil society support to ensure aid reaches beneficiaries directly in Sweida.

29 July 2025 – SNA Coordinator appeared again on "News Hour" to discuss ongoing humanitarian aid flows to Sweida, focusing on the fourth convoy, which included food, shelter kits, fuel, and medical supplies. He noted significant challenges in assessing needs and distributing aid due to the absence of specialized relief teams in the governorate, restrictions on humanitarian staff access, and complete reliance on the Syrian Red Crescent, which limits local civil society involvement and increases delivery costs. He also highlighted the lack of clear criteria for determining needs, transparency issues in distribution, and concerns that the current focus on Sweida may affect support for other areas in the future. He stressed the importance of documenting aid distribution, separating humanitarian work from political disputes, activating all stakeholders' roles, and planning for long-term needs such as the return of displaced persons and the operation of schools and essential services, affirming that Sweida deserves its fair share of humanitarian

30 July 2025 – SNA held a meeting with the Daraa Emergency Committee and alliance members to discuss the renewed humanitarian crisis in Sweida and its impact on Daraa Governorate. The meeting focused on securing basic needs for approximately 4,600 displaced families (around 25,000 individuals) due to recent clashes and movements of illegal armed groups. Plans included establishing a temporary camp on a government site near Sweida's administrative borders to meet urgent needs while ensuring the possibility of returning to original areas once conditions are safe. The meeting also covered infrastructure plans, provision of tents, housing units, bathing facilities, water, lighting, food supplies, and the activation of a coordination room involving local organizations to enhance response speed and unify efforts. The importance of collaboration with local civil society and urging UN organizations to accelerate support for camp establishment was emphasized, with high standards applied and lessons learned from previous camps to ensure quality humanitarian response.

➤ SYRIAN NGO ALLIANCE (SNA) ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES: AUGUST 2025

1 August 2025- SNA participated in a live interview on Al-Ikhbariya TV, addressing humanitarian challenges in As-Suwayda. The Coordinator highlighted how the presence of armed groups has hindered humanitarian access, disrupted needs assessments, and undermined transparency in aid distribution, warning that this could erode donor trust and jeopardize continued support.

3 August 2025- SNA met with the Rural Damascus Directorate of Education to discuss gaps in schools' needs. The Alliance requested a comprehensive list of affected schools and their requirements to help connect member organizations with opportunities to support the education sector.

5 August 2025- SNA joined the MedGlobal conference at Ibn Al-Nafis Hospital in Damascus, where the first batch of 30 dialysis machines was delivered, out of 140 to be distributed across Syria with the Ministry of Health and local partners. At the close of the event, SNA called on donors and supporters to help secure additional dialysis machines, water desalination units, and other critical equipment to ensure lifesaving healthcare services nationwide.

12 August 2025- On the occasion of World Humanitarian Day, SNA launched a digital campaign across its social media platforms to highlight the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The campaign featured ten essential articles from the declaration, shared through bilingual (Arabic–English) awareness designs.

13 August 2025- SNA appeared on Al-Ikhbariya TV to discuss the deteriorating health situation in As-Suwayda and other Syrian governorates. The Coordinator emphasized the severe shortages in funding, medicines, and medical equipment—particularly dialysis machines—and the immense pressure on hospitals to cope with chronic patients. He stressed that while coordination efforts continue, the overall health sector remains in a fragile state requiring long-term recovery efforts.

13 August 2025- SNA participated in a coordination meeting in Damascus with the Ministry of Emergency and Disaster Management, the Ministries of Health and Social Affairs, and the governors of As-Suwayda, Daraa, and Rural Damascus, alongside international humanitarian organizations. Discussions focused on strengthening emergency response in southern Syria and improving aid coordination.

19 August 2025- On World Humanitarian Day, SNA issued a statement commending humanitarian workers in Syria for their sacrifices and unwavering commitment over the years, despite immense challenges. The Alliance reaffirmed its dedication to supporting humanitarian action and strengthening collective efforts to meet people's needs across the country.

19 August 2025- SNA also joined Al-Ikhbariya TV for a special program marking World Humanitarian Day. The discussion reviewed over fourteen years of humanitarian response in Syria, highlighting the evolution from emergency aid distribution to running schools, hospitals, and essential services. Challenges such as funding shortages, bureaucratic constraints, attacks on aid workers, and new crises were also addressed, along with the urgent need to transition from emergency relief to sustainable recovery.

21 August 2025- SNA commemorated the 12th anniversary of the Ghouta chemical massacre with a post on its official channels, honoring the victims and reaffirming its commitment to humanitarian work and advocacy for civilians' rights and needs..

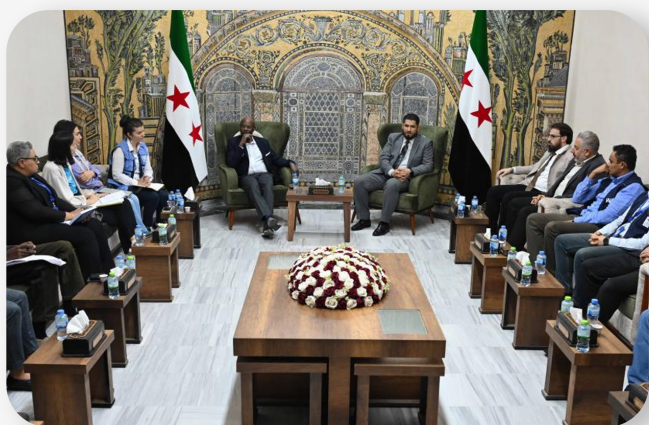
