➤ BACKGROUND:

Syrian NGOs (SNGOs) were established in response to the need for humanitarian assistance inside Syria and also meet the needs of Refugees in neighboring countries post March 2011. Some SNGOs felt the need for a body where common advocacy messages relating to humanitarian issues are being agreed. Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) saw the light on the 2nd April 2014 in Gaziantep, Turkey.

➤ WHO ARE WE?

SNA consists of **22 SNGOs** who are some of the largest SNGOs working to meet the Humanitarian needs in line with international standards and protocols. SNA provides the umbrella for these SNGOs to coordinate and advocate common messages ensuring the voices of affected populations heard. We play an active role when it comes to how aid is being delivered in Syria.

➤ SYRIAN NGO ALLIANCE (SNA) ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES:

September 9 – The Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) launched a new [introductory webpage](#) in English, providing a comprehensive overview of the Alliance, its objectives, governance structure, and areas of work in humanitarian coordination and advocacy. The page is designed to familiarize new institutions and individuals with SNA's role in supporting member organizations, highlighting its past experience, local and international partnerships, and showcasing key initiatives and programs aimed at ensuring an effective and inclusive humanitarian response inside Syria and beyond.

September 15 – The SNA Advocacy and Communications Officer met with OCHA Aleppo to discuss ways to strengthen collaboration with local associations. OCHA expressed appreciation for SNA's focus on engaging local actors and confirmed readiness to provide relevant support. They highlighted challenges faced by associations in Aleppo, including limited funding dependent on local traders, frozen assets in banks, and difficulties in renewing outdated licenses. OCHA proposed organizing a joint workshop with SNA and emphasized their willingness to be added to SNA's mailing lists, while also commending SNA's past advocacy campaigns.

September 16 – SNA Coordinator Mr. Saria Akkad appeared on Syrian Al-Ikhbariya TV to speak about the humanitarian situation in As-Suwayda. He highlighted the population's reliance on humanitarian assistance while stressing the need to stimulate the local economy and strengthen trade and industry. He discussed the role of civil society organizations in bridging temporary gaps and transitioning towards recovery, economic empowerment, and social cohesion. Mr. Akkad also addressed the impact of recent security appointments on easing NGO operations, as well as key challenges such as lack of data, drought, food insecurity, displacement, and funding constraints linked to sanctions. He outlined SNA's priorities moving forward, including health, education, food security, durable return solutions, and the need for a national recovery plan that shifts from emergency response to sustainable development.

September 17 – SNA held an introductory meeting with the Aleppo Associations Union, which currently includes 78 associations. SNA presented its structure, activities, and achievements in humanitarian work. Participants praised these efforts and discussed opportunities for future collaboration and coordination to maximize impact and exchange expertise among member organizations.

September 23–22 – SNA participated in ICVA’s regional workshop in Amman, Jordan: “Building Bridges in Times of Crisis: Regional Exchange of Humanitarian Networks in the MENA Region.” The workshop aimed to enhance knowledge sharing, address shared humanitarian challenges under protracted crises, and strengthen coordination, governance, and sustainability of networks. SNA highlighted its commitment to collective coordination, local solutions, and building resilient humanitarian structures capable of adapting to political, financial, and humanitarian shifts.

September 30 – SNA released its Southern Syria Humanitarian Response Report (July–September 2025), covering dozens of villages in Dar’a, As-Suwayda, and parts of Rural Damascus. Member organizations delivered multisectoral interventions in health, food security, WASH, shelter, protection, and energy, reaching over 75,000 people (around 15,300 families). Despite challenges such as access restrictions, limited funding, weak basic services, and protection risks, the report underscores the importance of joint action among SNA members. Upcoming activities include continued medical response, distribution of food and NFIs, preparation of reception centers, and hygiene awareness campaigns.

Syria continues to face a severe humanitarian crisis, the UN estimates 7.4 million IDPs and 16.5 million people in need of aid in 2025. Security remains unstable in some parts of the country, and access to basic services is limited.

From 8 December 2024 to June 2025, after the former government's fall, around 640,000 refugees have returned, with numbers expected to rise amid ongoing challenges.

Over 1.5 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) have also returned to their places of origin since the end of November 2024.

Based on actual and projected returns and triggered by calls on UNHCR from Syrian refugees to support them to return, UNHCR

Key Highlights

- One million Syrians – 1,027,887 – have now returned home from neighbouring countries since the 8 December 2024. A milestone of hope – yet millions remain displaced and urgent support is needed to make returns sustainable.
- At the same time, internal returns also continue, with 1,863,863 internally displaced persons (IDPs) having returned to their places of origin in Syria since late November last year, including 980,899 individuals who departed from IDP sites in the north of the country.
- Since the beginning of the year until 23 September, a total of 19,307 Syrian returnees have been supported by UNHCR at the key border crossing points with Türkiye – Bab Al-Salama, Bab
