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About the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA)

| Introduction and Objectives

Since 2011, Syrian civil society organizations have played a pivotal role in responding to the humanitarian crises resulting from the conflict, which led to the displacement of millions of civilians and a widespread collapse of the basic services infrastructure. With the onset of the transitional phase following the liberation of Syria in December 2024, the significance of this role became increasingly prominent in supporting recovery, rebuilding, and fostering community participation to ensure the restoration of Syrians' dignity and rights, while anchoring the foundations of good governance and sustainable development.

Against this backdrop, the Syrian NGO Alliance enhanced its operational framework to align with the imperatives of this new era. Following the acquisition of the necessary legal licenses by its member organizations, SNA commenced its operations from within the country, relocating its headquarters to the capital, Damascus, and expanding its national footprint.

This transition represents a critical turning point through which SNA realigned its priorities toward coordinating humanitarian and development efforts, contributing to recovery and reconstruction, promoting civil peace, embedding the principles of transparency and accountability, and empowering Syrians to actively participate in humanitarian and developmental decision-making.





| Who We Are

The Syrian NGO Alliance is an independent national network comprising Syrian civil society organizations operating in the humanitarian and development sectors. SNA is strictly committed to international humanitarian standards and the principles of transparency, accountability, and good governance.

SNA serves as a representative and coordinating platform aimed at unifying efforts, enhancing the role of member organizations, and supporting their engagement in recovery pathways, institutional rebuilding, and policy-making relevant to humanitarian and developmental affairs in Syria. By combining extensive field experience accumulated since 2011 with the institutional capacities developed by member organizations following their transition to operating internally, SNA amplifies the voice of Syrian civil society before national and international stakeholders, reinforcing its status as an effective partner in building modern Syria.

Activities of the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA)

- ✓ Throughout 2025, the Syrian NGO Alliance played a pivotal role in representing the voice of Syrian civil society at both local and international levels. This was achieved through its active participation in key international conferences and forums, most notably the "Humanitarian Action and Recovery in Syria" conference held in Damascus, which brought together more than 150 local and international organizations. During this event, SNA contributed significantly to drafting practical recommendations focused on localization, local leadership, sustainable funding, and ensuring the effective participation of local communities in decision-making pathways.
- ✓ Furthermore, SNA developed a comprehensive advocacy strategy that outlined the core priorities for humanitarian action and community development. This strategy placed a strong emphasis on funding sustainability and the empowerment of local organizations. To ensure that the priorities of civil society are consistently monitored and that the essential issues facing vulnerable groups are addressed, SNA regularly issued monthly briefs and policy recommendation papers, effectively conveying the Syrian perspective to donors and key decision-makers.
- ✓ To foster knowledge exchange and institutional capacity building, SNA organized a series of specialized workshops and expert forums. These initiatives featured advanced training modules covering strategic planning, contextual analysis, conflict management, and digital transformation. By facilitating the exchange of expertise between national organizations and international experts, SNA enhanced the capacities of Syrian organizations to design and execute highly effective, sustainable humanitarian and developmental programs.





- ✓ SNA also convened multiple high-level coordination meetings with the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor, alongside other government entities. These efforts aimed to institutionalize civil society participation in decision-making processes, expedite official approvals, and optimize the operational environment for humanitarian actors. Additionally, SNA supported the Ministry in operationalizing the case management framework for beneficiaries, thereby strengthening overall coordination and transparency.
- ✓ In line with its strategic expansion, SNA broadened its partnership network with prominent international bodies, including ICVA, Oxfam, NORAD, and the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF), in addition to several European donors. These partnerships served to exchange technical expertise, sponsor joint initiatives, and guarantee that the voice of Syrian civil society is integrated into international platforms and global policy-making circles.
- ✓ Concurrently, SNA actively championed the rights and causes of women, youth, and vulnerable demographics. This was translated into targeted initiatives aimed at protecting women in post-conflict phases, amplifying youth engagement in decision-making, and supporting persons with disabilities. SNA provided essential legal and psychosocial support for women, fostered economic empowerment for youth, and advocated for the protection of civic space, thereby reinforcing the inclusivity of humanitarian and developmental efforts.



- ✓ Addressing systemic operational bottlenecks, SNA proactively tackled the funding challenges and banking restrictions encountered by Syrian organizations. The alliance provided structured recommendations to diversify funding streams, promote long-term institutional funding, and establish locally-led pooled fund mechanisms. It also contributed substantially to formulating a national framework for localization and elevating the quality of partnerships between local organizations and international donors.
- ✓ To advance institutional accountability and structural cohesion, SNA spearheaded strategic projects such as B-VOICES. These projects were instrumental in enhancing inclusivity, accountability, and synergy among Syrian organizations, while ensuring the institutionalization of effective national coordination practices. Additionally, SNA contributed to the advancement of humanitarian data tools to optimize planning and targeted interventions, while systematically streamlining voluntary return processes for returnees to Syria.
- ✓ To ensure rigid compliance with international benchmarks, SNA institutionalized dedicated monitoring, evaluation, accountability, and learning (MEAL) mechanisms. Through systematic data collection and analysis, the production of comprehensive policy briefs, and the rigorous review of project outcomes, SNA ensured the assimilation of best practices and maximized the tangible field impact of humanitarian and developmental programs on the ground.
- ✓ Finally, SNA continuously upgraded the professional skills of its member organizations through tailored training and mentorship tracks. It actively participated in public advocacy events and launched strategic media campaigns to highlight the critical role of Syrian civil society. SNA also backed specialized workshops on mine action, economic recovery programs, and the rehabilitation of basic services, while consistently reaffirming that local community leadership must remain the cornerstone of all interventions. This holistic approach underscores SNA's unique capacity to seamlessly merge coordination, evidence-based advocacy, and institutional capacity building within its overarching strategic vision for 2025.

| Key Achievements of the Alliance in Coordination and Advocacy (2025)

- ✓ In 2025, the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) advanced its advocacy and coordination, strengthening the Syrian civil society's local and international presence. SNA developed a comprehensive advocacy strategy with practical recommendations for donors and stakeholders, establishing humanitarian and local development priorities, and tracking progress through monthly updates and policy papers shared with partners.
- ✓ SNA co-organized and managed strategic events, notably the conference "Humanitarian Action and Recovery in Syria: Local Solutions for Sustainable Impact," defining discussion tracks and drafting actionable recommendations on funding, community engagement, and local leadership. It also boosted Syrian NGOs' participation in international dialogue platforms, including Senior Humanitarian Officials meetings in Norway and regional workshops, to highlight challenges in funding, localization, and the necessity of investing in local capacities.
- ✓ To support coordination, SNA enhanced cooperation with relevant Syrian ministries and facilitated communication between member organizations and government entities to follow up on conference and workshop outcomes and integrate civil society recommendations into national plans. Additionally, it coordinated with international partners—such as ICVA, Oxfam, NORAD, and BAMF—to exchange expertise and facilitate joint projects targeting the most vulnerable groups, including returning women, youth, and persons with disabilities.





- ✓ SNA focused on enhancing local representation within financing and advocacy mechanisms by developing tools and policy papers to identify humanitarian needs, track funding, and operationalize accountability between local organizations and international donors. It also contributed to preparing targeted consultations and research, alongside interactive workshops for knowledge exchange, ensuring the synergy of coordination efforts between Syrian civil society and international organizations
- ✓ Through these efforts, SNA has demonstrated that it is not merely a coordinator among Syrian organizations, but a leading voice representing civil society in advocacy and policy formulation. It continuously works to ensure funding sustainability, strengthen partnerships, and expand the scope of local decision-making, thereby guaranteeing the effectiveness of the humanitarian and developmental response in Syria

➤ A Letter Demanding the Lifting of Sanctions on Syria, in Cooperation with the Syrian American Council (SAC)

Joint Advocacy Letter

January 2025

In cooperation with the Syrian American Council, the Syrian NGO Alliance addressed a letter to the US Administration demanding sanctions relief, with the endorsement of 162 international organizations. The letter stressed the critical need to ease restrictions to support early recovery, rehabilitate basic infrastructure, and foster economic stability, thereby guaranteeing the unhindered delivery of humanitarian aid and facilitating reconstruction efforts to serve the Syrian population.



➤ Signing a Letter Addressed to the Foreign Relations Committee in the US Senate

The Syrian NGO Alliance, alongside 158 organizations, signed a letter addressed to the US Senate Foreign Relations Committee, calling for a strategic shift in policy toward Syria. The recommendations focused on lifting investment bans, easing sanctions, and restoring diplomatic relations to ensure the continuity of humanitarian aid and support economic stability and recovery.

The final statement focused on strengthening national leadership, developing equitable partnerships, and diversifying funding sources, while stressing the necessity of empowering civil society to lead the transition from emergency relief to sustainable development.

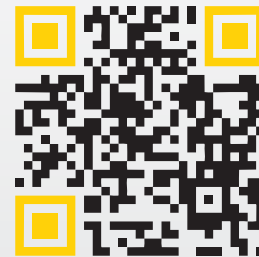
