## **BACKGROUND:**

Syrian NGOs were established in response to the humanitarian crisis that erupted in Syria after 2011, with the aim of addressing the growing humanitarian needs of affected populations within the country and in neighboring states. As the crisis evolved, several of these organizations recognized the need for a unified coordination framework to consolidate efforts and agree on joint advocacy messages related to humanitarian and development issues.

The Syrian NGO Alliance was launched in April 2014 in Gaziantep, Türkiye, as a coordination and representative platform for Syrian civil society NGOs. With the onset of the transitional phase after December 2024 and the changing national context, the Alliance adapted its role to align with new priorities related to recovery, strengthening the resilience of local communities, and contributing to reconstruction. The Alliance commenced its operations from the capital, Damascus, following the acquisition of the necessary legal registrations for its member NGOs to operate within Syria.

## **HOW ARE WE?**

The Syrian NGO Alliance is an independent national network comprising Syrian civil society NGOs working in the humanitarian and development sectors, committed to international humanitarian standards and the principles of transparency, accountability, and good governance.

Building on field experience accumulated since 2011, the Alliance serves as a coordination umbrella for its members, enhancing collective action and joint advocacy to ensure that the voices of affected communities are heard at both national and international levels. The Alliance also plays an active role in supporting the coordination of humanitarian responses and recovery efforts, as well as contributing to dialogue on humanitarian and development policies in Syria.

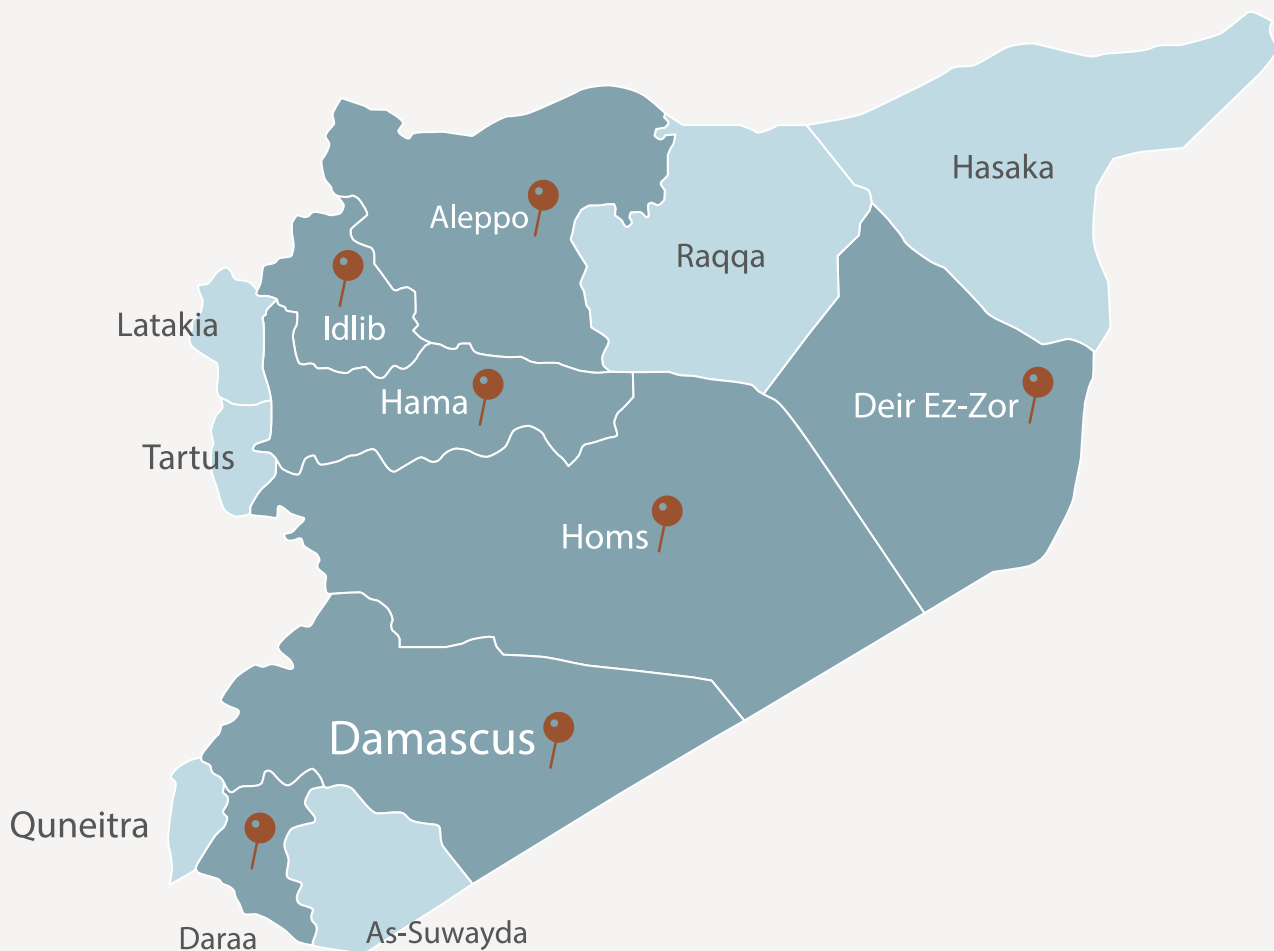

## NEWSLETTER OVERVIEW

This month's bulletin includes 15 activities implemented by 15 organizations across 8 humanitarian sectors, covering Food Security and Livelihoods, Protection, Health, Education, Recovery and Development, Emergency Response, Shelter and Non-Food Items, and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, with particular emphasis on Food Security and Livelihoods, Health, Protection, and Education. The bulletin also highlights two advocacy outputs, including a media intervention by the Coordinator of the Syrian NGO Alliance on the Syrian News Channel addressing humanitarian developments in Aleppo, as well as the Alliance's engagement in national capacity-building efforts related to risk education on explosive remnants of war and humanitarian negotiation, as part of its ongoing national-level coordination role.

## ADVOCACY UPDATES

### ➤ SNA ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES

From **16–14 June 2026**, the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) organized and participated in an intensive training workshop on "Humanitarian Diplomacy and Frontline Negotiations," delivered by the Centre of Competence on Humanitarian Negotiation (CCHN). The training saw broad and inclusive participation from representatives of civil society organizations and associations across various Syrian geographies, alongside active engagement from SNA member organizations. The Alliance undertook direct oversight and full technical coordination to ensure the training launched on schedule. Additionally, the SNA representative participated in a dual capacity—as both a trainee and an official observer—to evaluate the training outcomes and their adaptability to the Syrian context, while providing immediate support in facilitating sessions for the CCHN team when needed, contributing to the workshop's success and enhancing frontline negotiation skills for participants on the ground.

On **22 June 2026**, the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA), in cooperation with its partners—the Danish Refugee Council (DRC) and the Diaspora Emergency Action & Coordination (DEMAC)—held the in-person final event of the "Bridging Voices" (B-Voices) project at the Omayad Hotel in Damascus, titled "Strengthening Inclusive Coordination & Civil Society Cohesion in Syria." The event was attended by approximately 35 participants representing local and international organizations, UN agencies, and OCHA. The agenda included reviewing the key findings of the project's primary research, titled "From Presence to Decision," followed by a specialized, in-depth discussion on final recommendations to strengthen a Syrian-led humanitarian coordination system. The event concluded with an open discussion session to answer questions and exchange views on sustainable empowerment mechanisms for civil society networks.

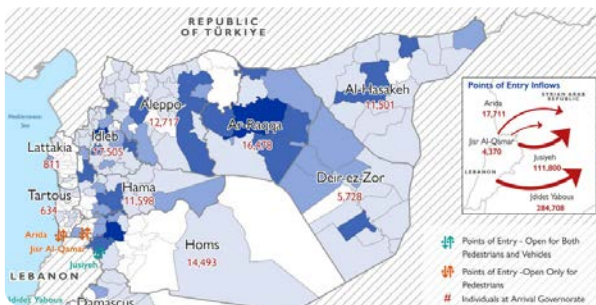
